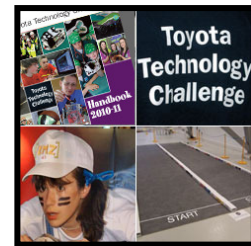

Specialism Update

Humanities

We have been busily planning for a very active year within the Humanities Specialism and a number of activities have already taken place.

As part of our Enterprise initiatives this year, we are continuing to run the Young Enterprise Company programme at St Bede's. All Year 11's attended a presentation on the benefits of enterprise education, and we were delighted when over 25 students showed interest in taking part in the scheme. They will be supported by a number of local and national businesses including HSBC and ARM. As a result, they have created a Young Enterprise Company who will be busy selling products and raising funds. Their first event will be selling refreshments at the Sponsored Walk.

Last year our current Year 11 successfully completed their GCSE in Citizenship and we were delighted with their results – over 73 % achieved an A* to C. The current Year 10 students are now studying for their GCSE Citizenship exam which they will sit in May 2011. Citizenship is compulsory at Key Stages 3 and 4 and providing a program of study leading to a GCSE qualification helps to positively reinforce students' Citizenship studies during their time at St Bede's. This year 60% of marks will come from students working to advocate and represent a voluntary organisation or pressure group – for example the work of the NSPCC. Students are busy preparing presentations that they will give to Lower School tutor groups at the beginning of the Spring Term.

In Key Stage 3, students will have a number of Citizenship Days. The Year 8s took part in a day with the theme of 'Media and Society', which they thoroughly enjoyed. Next half term Year 9 will take part in a day with the theme of 'Political Rights and Voting'.

We have launched our residential History Curriculum visit for Year 8 to Holland and Belgium, and Geography Curriculum visit to the Yorkshire Dales for Year 9. Year 10 and 11 Leisure and Tourism students have visited Alton Towers to look at business systems, marketing and customer service. The Year 11 History students have visited London as part of their History of Medicine Unit where they visited The Old Operating Theatre and went on a Public Health Walk. The Year 11 Geographers will go to Ely after half term to prepare for their Controlled Assessment based on Economic Activity.

Year 8 had a visit from 'Zoolabs Rainforest Road Show' as part of their Geography and Science work on Ecosystems. The students enjoyed learning about and handling creatures from the rainforest including tarantulas, giant millipedes, giant African land snails, rats and snakes !

As part of our International Schools Award we celebrated the European Day of Languages. Mrs Barton and a group of Key Stage 3 pupils led an assembly on world languages and dialects. Students took part in a quiz based on languages during their break and lunch time. Many lessons included language themed activities including a Maths lesson with numbers in Russian, RE lessons with vocabulary in Spanish and English lessons with a quiz on French words commonly used in the English language. All Year 7 pupils were given a 'Passport to the European Union' with information, stickers and puzzles based on the European Union.

Cambridge Union Debating Workshop
