Happy Christmas and every good wish for 2025 from everyone at St Bede's Inter-Church School



Year 7 Reflection Day at Ely Cathedral

Year 7 students enjoyed a day exploring the magnificent Ely Cathedral. They discovered what life was like for the monks who lived in the medieval monastery there, including the sign language they

needed during silent meal times, and the beautiful manuscripts they

wrote and read.

Students also had the chance to pray the labyrinth, discovering an ongoing journey into the heart of God's presence (rather than a maze with dead ends).



At midday a bell was rung and the Cathedral Chaplain led everyone in 5 minutes of prayer. It was great to hear St Bede's School being prayed for in the Cathedral, just as we were thinking about who we might pray for and why.



Science and Religion - Year 11 Reflection Day





'What happens to a person's energy after death?'

'Why did God need to rest after 6 days of work?'

'If God and God's creation is good, why do people get sick?'

These were some of the questions our Y11 students put to our panel of experts from the Faraday Institute at their Reflection Day.

A reflection on God's words to Job about creation set the tone for the day as one of questioning and wonder and a great keynote address, complete with setting fire to gas-filled bubbles, launched us into the science. The speakers were hugely engaging and led us through a range of disciplines. A medical physicist used the laws of probability to consider the likelihood of human life existing. An evolutionary biologist used an extensive fossil collection to consider the origins of life. A cancer radiographer considered the case for miracles. A micro-biologist explored the adaptations of cells and proteins to the harshest environments on the planet and a translator challenged us to think critically about the text we call 'The Bible'.

It was a truly stimulating day covering many different aspects of our learning and faith.

Visit to a German Christmas Market

Our trip to Aachen took place from the 22nd-23rd of November, taking us through four countries along our journey. On an early coach to Dover, we were able to board our ferry at just 7:40am, taking us over to France. Once there, we continued on the road through Belgium and Germany, before arriving in Aachen where we were met with fields of snow.

We checked in and made our beds at our hostel before walking to the market, where we first took a tour of Aachen Cathedral. This was one of the most impressive features of our trip: The cathedral boasts a 72m spire and has interiors fully decorated with intricate patterns, figures, gold leaf, and exquisite marble architecture.

The market itself was filled with delicious food, merry locals and lots of Christmas cheer. Wooden stalls offered an impressive variety of food, drinks, decorations and gifts; they offered enough of everything to satisfy you for many Christmases to come. Unfortunately, we had been somewhat unprepared for the European climate, so returned to our hostel for a warming dinner and a full night of sleep.

After breakfast on the second day, we left to explore the local Lindt factory shop where so much chocolate was bought at an impressively low price.

Our coach, now far heavier, proceeded to leave Aachen and thus began our journey back to Calais; we encountered some grumpy French and cheerier British border officers along the way, as well as border police with a cute sniffer dog. Thankfully, storm Bert didn't cause us any delay; we were made to suffer through a choppy ferry ride but arrived back in Cambridge in perfect time, thus ending our trip just 44 hours after it began.

Curwen Press visited St Bede's on 24th October 2024 for a printing workshop with our year 10 Art and Textiles students.


The students were very engaged and responded enthusiastically to the advice and supervision of the Curwen Press staff. They produced some excellent prints.


