## Question Type and Timing Advice for English Literature Papers

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English Literature Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th-century novel
What's assessed?
Shakespeare - Either 'Macbeth' or 'Romeo and Juliet'
The 19th-century novel - Either 'A Christmas Carol' or 'The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde'
How it's assessed \bullet written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes \bullet 64 marks \bullet 40% of GCSE
Section A - Shakespeare: students will answer one question on their play of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole. Students should spend about 50 minutes on Question 1 and students with extra time should spend 62 minutes. There are 34 marks available.
Section B - The 19th-century novel: students will answer one question on their novel of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and then to write about the novel as a whole. An ability to refer to quotations from across the play will enhance the quality of the answer. Students should spend about 50 minutes on Question 2 and students with extra time should spend 62 minutes. There are 30 marks available.
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English Literature Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry
What's assessed?
Modern texts - 'An Inspector Calls' or 'Blood Brothers'
Poetry - poems from the relationship cluster
Unseen poetry
How it's assessed • written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes • 96 marks • 60% of GCSE
Section A - Modern texts: students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their
studied modern prose or drama text. Students should spend about 45 minutes answering this
question and students with extra time should spend 56 minutes. There are 34 marks available.
Students will need to recall quotations from the play.
Section B - Poetry: students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster. Students should spend about 45 minutes answering this question and students with extra time should spend 56 minutes. There are 30 marks available. Students will need to recall quotations from all of the poems.
Section C - Unseen poetry: Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem. There are 24 marks available for the first question in this section and students should spend about 5 minutes reading the poem and 25 minutes writing their response and students with extra time should spend 37 minutes in total on this question. There are 8 marks available for the second question in this section. Students should spend about 5 minutes reading the poem and 10 minutes writing their response and students with extra time should spend 18 minutes in total on this question.
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$5 \%$ of the marks are for written accuracy. This is assessed in Question 1 of both Paper 1 and 2.
